**BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 14  
Series of 2025**

**SUBJECT: A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE PHILIPPINE DRUG ENFORCEMENT AGENCY (PDEA) AND PARTNER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES FOR THEIR SIGNIFICANT ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN DRUG SUPPLY REDUCTION UNDER THE NATIONAL ANTI-DRUG CAMPAIGN**

**WHEREAS**, Section 4, Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution states, among others that, “The prime duty of the Government is to serve and protect the people.”

**WHEREAS**, Section 5, Article II of the same Constitution further states that, “The maintenance of peace and order, the protection of life, liberty, and property, and the promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy.”

**WHEREAS**, Republic Act No. 9165 or the *Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002* (the “Act”), as amended, mandates the Dangerous Drugs Board (DDB) to be the policy-making and strategy-formulating body in the planning and formulation of policies and programs on drug prevention and control;

**WHEREAS**, in line with the mandate of the Board, Executive Order No. 66, series of 2018, entitled “*Institutionalization of the Philippine Anti-Illegal Drugs Strategy (PADS)*,” was issued to serve as the national framework of the Philippine Government in addressing the illegal drug problem, giving primacy to drug supply reduction and drug demand reduction as its two (2) main pillars;

**WHEREAS**, during the 205<sup>th</sup> Regular Meeting of the Board on 20 August 2025, the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) reported on its successful anti-drug operation in Zamboanga, which was conducted jointly with the Philippine National Police (PNP) and the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) through an intelligence-based initiative;

**WHEREAS**, the operation led to the confiscation of four (4) kilograms of shabu and the subsequent interception of a transshipment involving sixty-seven (67) kilograms

of illegal drugs, constituting a significant accomplishment in the government's efforts to reduce the supply of dangerous drugs in the country;

**WHEREAS**, the confiscated illegal drugs are presently under the custody of the forensic laboratory of the PDEA for profiling and examination, thus underscoring the professionalism and diligence of law enforcement agencies in ensuring the proper handling, custody, and disposition of evidence in accordance with Section 21 of Republic Act No. 9165 and Board Regulation No. 4, series of 2023 or the "*Guidelines on Drug Profiling.*"

**WHEREAS**, these accomplishments were achieved through the adoption of a whole-of-nation approach, consistent with the directive of the President to enhance inter-agency collaboration in drug law enforcement operations;

**WHEREAS**, these law enforcement operations manifest the unwavering commitment, dedication, and collaboration of the PDEA, PNP, AFP, and other law enforcement agencies in advancing the national anti-drug campaign and significantly disrupting illegal drug supply chains;

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it **RESOLVED**, as it is hereby **RESOLVED**, that the Dangerous Drugs Board commends the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency, the Philippine National Police, the Armed Forces of the Philippines, and other law enforcement agencies for their significant accomplishments in drug supply reduction efforts, and for advancing a strategy that strengthens law enforcement actions while safeguarding human rights and promoting public safety.
